A hard copy of the Agenda and Meeting 51 Presentation was provided to all meeting attendees.

1. Introduction and Welcome

Lisa Andrews (LA) opened the meeting and welcomed all attendees to the Moolarben Coal Operations (MCO) CCC. GA was introduced and advised that he was filling in for SA.

3. Business Arising from Previous Finalised Minutes

There was no business arising from Meeting 50.

Action 1: University of Queensland reviewing monitoring data to develop scope as part of Independent Water Quality Study. Hold over to the next meeting.

Action 2: Property purchased in Q2 2018

Action 3: Groundwater information provided in presentation.

Action 4: Proposed dewatering site is an expansion of the existing approved site located approximately 270m from river and 400m from the Drip.

Action 5: EPBC referral - Completed 12/11/19.

Action 6: Drip Deed - Land Registry Services in process of registering easements. Next steps dependent on LRS completing registration.

Correspondence

Correspondence to the CCC since meeting 50 included the following:

- 18/9/19 Draft minutes sent to CCC members for review. Comments received back from JI and were incorporated into the minutes.

- 3/10/19 Email to CCC members advising of the lodgment of Modification 15 with DPIE.
- 12/11/19 Email from MCO advising that the EPBC referral has been submitted. This information forwarded on to members.
- 14/11/19 Email to members with the Meeting Notice & Agenda for this meeting with the Correspondence Report.

CCC Update Presentation

GC provided an update on the Community Support Program (CSP) including events and initiatives supported by MCO, along with upcoming events MCO are also assisting.

TC provided an operational update.

BS asked when the Water Treatment Plant (WTP) will be completed. GC advised MCO will start commissioning the WTP in December 2019 with releases dependent on sub-ordinate approvals (eg Environmental Management Plans) and operational requirements.

JI asked for the Underground (UG) water make. GC advised the average dewatering from the UG is approximately 70 litres per second including water input and recirculation.

JI asked for the location of the Spontaneous Combustion. TC advised of occurrence in OC2 and described current actions MCO are undertaking. DS asked if MCO can compact the area. TC advised compaction is a method that MCO can use. JI raised concern that current dry and hot climatic conditions have a potential to increase the risks.

TC provided an exploration update.

BS asked when MCO will be mining in OC3. GC advised mining will commence in the first quarter of 2020. JI asked if MCO is relinquishing exploration sites in EL6288. TC confirmed MCO is progressively relinquishing exploration sites in EL6288. GC outlined the process of approval, rehabilitation and relinquishment of exploration sites.

TC provided an update on environmental monitoring including water quality, air quality, noise and complaints. General discussion of water quality and level monitoring results, Rainfall Cumulative Deficit (RCD), operations and climatic conditions.

BS asked what is MCO's expectation for noise levels when mining in OC3. GC advised the current noise mitigation methods will continue to be employed and that OC3 workings will generally be more sheltered than OC2 operations. BS asked if the Noise Policy for Industry is applicable for low frequency noise. GC advised that the Noise Policy for Industry, including the low frequency noise provisions is applicable for MCO. General discussion of Industrial Noise Policy, and Noise Policy for Industry and transitional arrangements for low frequency noise.

LA asked if MCO investigated noise complaints at the time of the complaint. TC explained the MCO complaints management process, including investigations and responses.

BS asked about the potential for dust generation from rehabilitation during on-going dry conditions. TC discussed current methodologies used to minimise potential dust from rehabilitated areas and the considerations of climatic conditions during rehabilitation planning. TC provided an update on Rehabilitation and Biodiversity Offset Management.

LA asked if MCO were successful in baiting wild dogs as a result of recent Wild Dog baiting programs. TC and MC confirmed the recent MCO Wild Dog Baiting programs were considered successful based on the percentage of baits taken.

GC provided an employment update.

GC provided update on the UG4 Ancillary Works Modification

JI asked if the Submissions Report is on the website. GC confirmed that the Submissions Report is on the Planning website. GC explained there were some late Agency submissions which have not been published on the Planning website.

At this time, some CCC members were receiving notifications on their mobile phones regarding a bush fire in the Ulan area. HU left at 4.21pm providing her apologies.

4. General Business

JI advised the CCC that she had completed her PhD and her formal graduation will be 12/12/19.

BS asked if MCO had altered their train movements during recent catastrophic Fire Danger days. GC advised that ARTC are responsible for train movements and noted that train movements had been halted during the previous Kaines Flat Fire.




Operational Update

- Rehabilitation and monitoring activities have continued during the period.



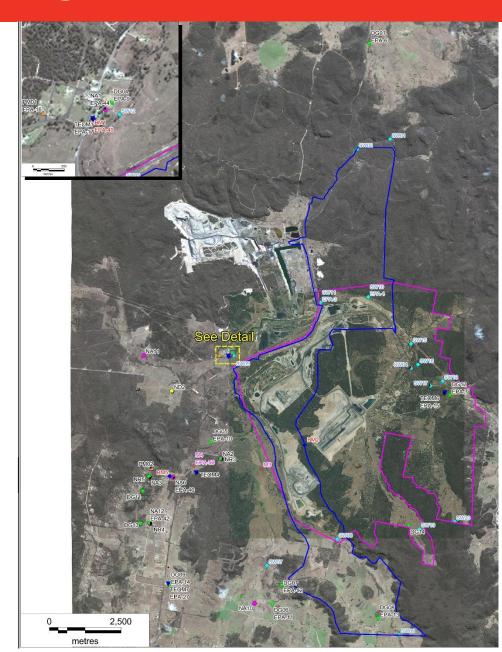









Water Quality - pH






Water Quality - EC







Water Quality - TSS






Water Quality - Groundwater







Groundwater - Level


HYDROGRAPHS - Palaeochannel and Alluvium













UG4 Ancillary Works Modification

Modification Overview


- Modification to Stage 1 Project Approval

- Key issues raised in submissions included impact to Goulburn River water quality, impacts to offset area, cultural heritage, noise, traffic and visual impacts.
- EPBC referral submitted for Commonwealth Department of Energy and Environment.
